

About the Program

Since launching in 2021, the AGF Junior Girls Scholarship Program has grown from 37 clubs and 226 girls to 173 clubs and 1,608 girls in 2026. In 2027, our goal is to support more than 1,700 girls across Australia, helping them build confidence, develop their skills and create a lifelong connection to golf.

Why Become a Scholarship Club?

The AGF Junior Girls Scholarship Program helps create a place where girls feel they belong. Through a structured pathway of coaching, club membership and on-course opportunities, the program helps girls build lasting connections with your club, develop confidence and form friendships that keep them engaged in golf for years to come.

By becoming a Scholarship Club, you will:

- Create a welcoming and inclusive environment where girls feel they belong.
- Strengthen connections with families and your local community.
- Grow junior female participation and club membership.
- Support girls to build confidence, friendships and a lifelong connection to golf.

Program Snapshot

Successful clubs receive \$2,100 + GST in funding (double funding available for programs with more than 10 participants) to support the delivery of:

- 24 one-hour coaching sessions delivered by a PGA Professional and/or National Program Deliverer.
- A free 12-month junior club membership with playing rights for every scholar.
- An AGF Scholarship shirt and cap for each participant.
- Access to the Junior Girls Alumni Program and ongoing support from Golf Australia.

Who is the Program For?

The program is designed for girls aged 9–16 who have some previous golf experience and are ready to progress from introductory clinics to club membership, obtaining a handicap and playing on course.





Program Terms & Conditions

- Funding of \$2,100 + GST must be used to deliver 24 one-hour group coaching sessions for scholarship participants, facilitated by a PGA Professional and/or National Program Deliverer.
- Scholarship participants must not be charged any fees to participate in the program. The funding provided, together with the club's contribution where required, must ensure all coaching sessions are delivered at no cost to the girls.
- The program must be delivered during the 2027 calendar year, unless an extension has been approved by Golf Australia.
- Venues are responsible for:
 - Any costs that exceed the funding provided.
 - Completing the required pre- and post-program reporting.
 - Required to host a graduation ceremony at the conclusion of the program
- All programs and participants must be uploaded to the MyGolf platform.
- Funding will only be released once all program non-negotiables have been met. Venue non-negotiables are:
 - Provide a 12 month free membership to all scholars
 - Provide 24 weeks of lessons to the girls across the year
 - Girls **must not** pay for their lessons, this is to be supplied by the venue for free
- Participants should have some prior golf experience and be ready to progress to on-course play and obtaining a handicap.
- The recommended participant age is 9–16 years. Girls aged 7–8 may be considered where appropriate.
- The program is intended to recruit **new** participants into your club each year. Exceptional circumstances will be considered on a case-by-case basis.
